Retail Trade Industry

To reduce workplace injuries and fatalities, we must understand when, why and how they happen. Having this data on hand will allow businesses in hazardous industries to target problem areas and initiate solutions to reduce workplace accidents.

The Retail Trade sector is comprised of establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise to the general public.

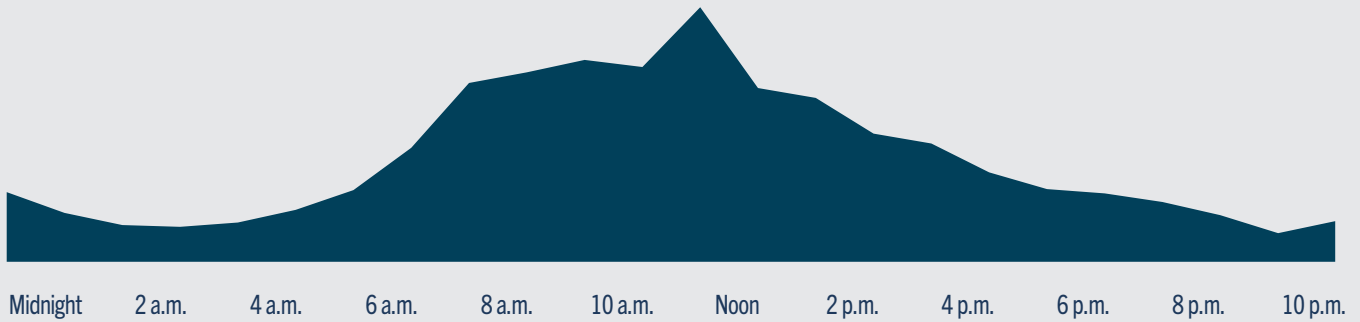

Most Retail Trade incidents occurred during the Noon hour.



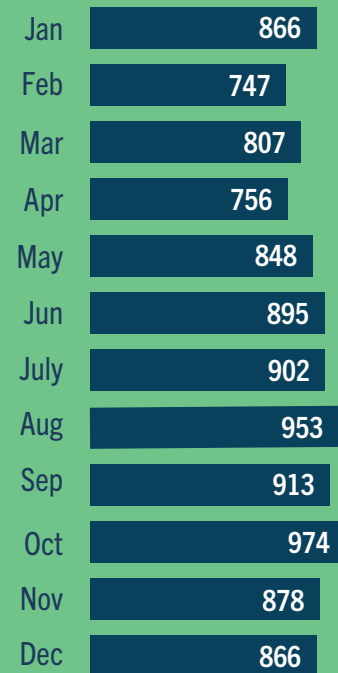
INJURY INCIDENTS BY DAY OF THE WEEK

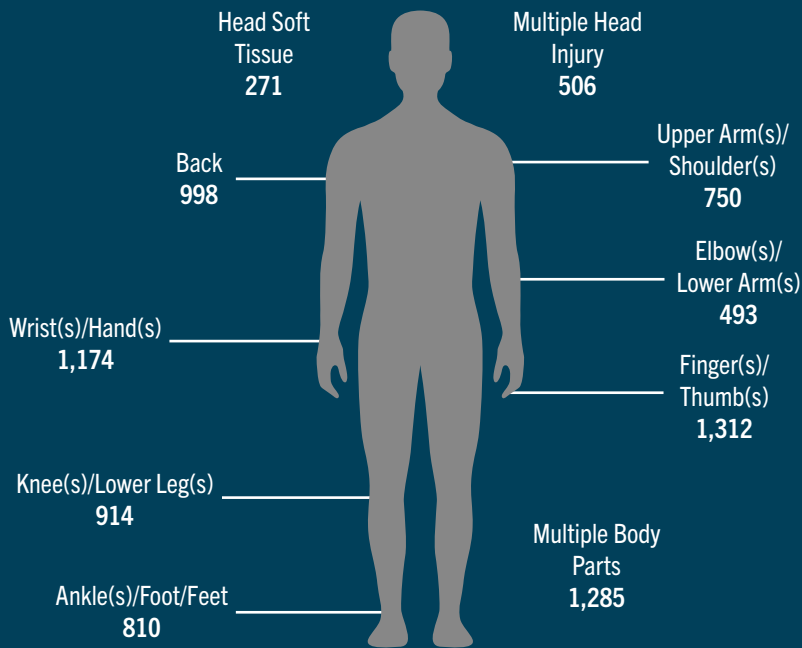
INJURY INCIDENTS BY MONTH

The highest number of Retail Trade incidents occurred in October.



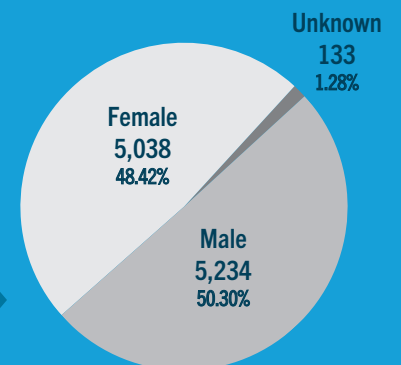
TOP 10 INJURY INCIDENTS BY BODY PART

In Retail Trade, males had more incidents than females.



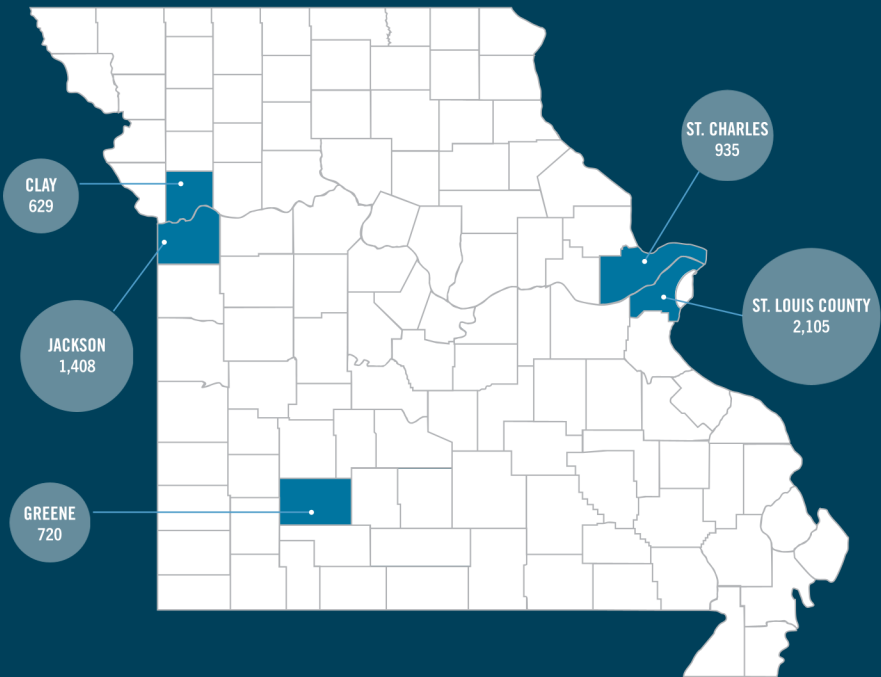
INCIDENTS BY AGE GROUP

St. Louis County had the most Retail Trade injury incidents.

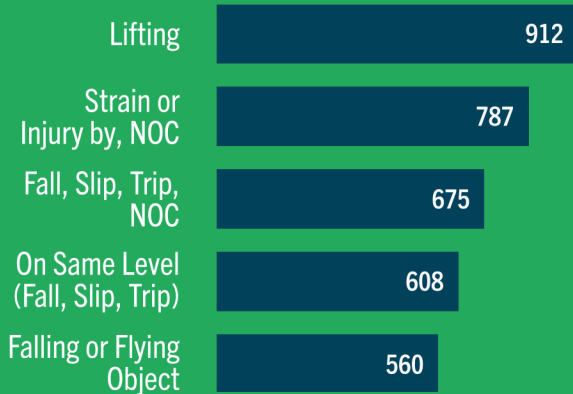

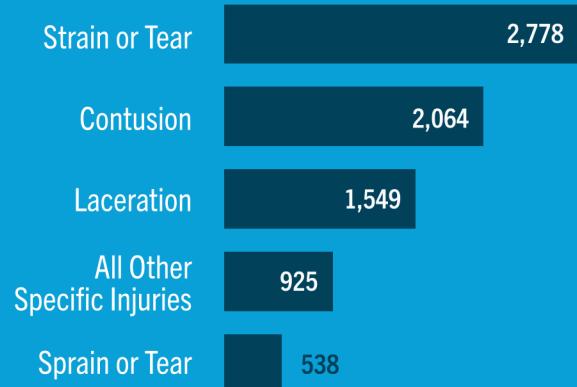
INCIDENTS BY CAUSE
