AMENDED STIPULATION OF FACT

Come now the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Division of Labor Standards and the International Association of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Iron Workers, Local 396 ("Objector"), and stipulate to the following facts:

1. Objector is an unincorporated association representing members who perform work in the construction trades and specifically under the Occupational Title of "Ironworker," as defined in 8 C.S.R. 30-3.060, throughout the eastern half of the State of Missouri of the type covered by R.S.Mo. § 290.210, *et seq.* (the "Missouri Prevailing Wage Law").
2. Pike County is subject to the Missouri Prevailing Wage Law.
3. On March 8, 2019, the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations issued its proposed Annual Wage Order No. 26 for Pike County.
4. The rate for the "Ironworker" occupational title in Pike County in proposed Annual Wage Order No. 26 is \$19.06. According to Annual Wage Order No. 26, this rate was used because fewer than 1,000 hours were submitted pursuant to R.S.Mo. § 290.257.2.
5. On March 27, 2019, Objector filed a timely objection to the "Ironworker" occupational title in Pike County.

6. In support of its objection, Objector submitted evidence that in 2018, 2,387.5 hours of "Ironworker" construction work was performed by employees of PJR & Associates, Inc. within Pike County.

7. According to the evidence submitted by Objector, during the period of January 1, 2018 through July 31, 2018, PJR & Associates, Inc. paid Ironworkers at the rate of \$33.96 in wages and \$25.92 in fringe benefits. During the period of August 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, PJR & Associates, Inc. paid Ironworkers at the rate of \$33.96 in wages and \$27.42 in fringe benefits. The above mentioned hours were worked pursuant to PJR & Associates, Inc.'s collective bargaining agreement with Objector.

8. The hours submitted by PJR & Associates, Inc. were the only hours submitted for the "Ironworker" occupational title in that type of construction work performed in Pike County.


9. PJR & Associates, Inc. submitted its hours to the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations on March 25, 2019.

10. The parties stipulate that the issue before the Commission is whether the hours submitted by PJR & Associates, Inc. should be considered due to the date they were submitted, and if the hours are considered, what is the appropriate rate for the "Ironworker" occupational title in Pike County.

WHEREFORE, the parties submit the above stipulation of fact and respectfully request that the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission consider the issues submitted by the parties and vacate the April 30, 2019 prehearing and May 21-22, 2019 hearing on this objection.


