

**ORDER OF COMMISSION**

In Re: Motion to Amend Annual Wage Order No. 20 filed by the Division of Labor Standards, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

On March 22, 2013, a Motion to Amend Annual Wage Order No. 20 was filed by the Division of Labor Standards (Division) with the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission (Commission) for the Commission's consideration and action. Annual Wage Order No. 20 had previously been filed on March 8, 2013, with the Secretary of State's Office.

The Motion indicated its purpose is to correct typographical, grammatical, and clerical errors discovered by the Division subsequent to the filing of the wage order with the Secretary of State's Office. Attached to the Motion are 100 pages that the Division alleges contain the needed corrections. The Motion requests that the Commission enter an order to substitute the designated pages attached for the original pages found in Annual Wage Order No. 20, along with any other relief that the Commission deems appropriate.

In the course of reviewing the Motion, we discovered that the only way to determine the changes that the Division seeks to make to Annual Wage Order No. 20 is to conduct a line-by-line review of the 100 replacement pages attached to the Motion. Such a review is complicated by the fact that the occupational titles affected by the Division's Motion differ by county.

We note that the deadline for filing objections to Annual Wage Order No. 20 is April 8, 2013. It appears to the Commission that an interested party attempting to determine whether to object to the Division's Motion will be substantially prejudiced by the Division's failure to specify, in the body of its Motion or by attachment, what counties and occupational titles are affected by the changes it seeks to make.

In light of these considerations, the Commission cannot consider the Division's Motion in its current form. The Commission directs the Division to file an Amended Motion specifically setting forth, within the body of the Motion or by attachment, each county affected by the changes, and each occupational title affected within the county, so that interested parties will have a reasonable opportunity to determine whether they are affected by the changes the Division seeks to make.
