Mine and Cave Safety and Health Program

The Mine and Cave Safety and Health Program trains Missouri miners in implementing safe and healthy working habits at the workplace. Training services include safety and health, first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and mine rescue. Training is provided at no charge.

The program also offers safety and health consultation services. Mine and cave safety inspectors assist miners with mine openings, mine closings, safety programs and compliance with Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) standards. The Mine Inspection Section regularly inspects mines in order to help create safe and healthy working conditions for mine employees.

Companies that have used the program's services have experienced many benefits. Employers have reduced accidents and injuries in their workplaces. Fewer accidents and injuries create workplace environments which can lower workers' compensation costs, increase employee attendance and productivity and improve employee morale.

The Mine and Cave Safety and Health Program offers services for **mines**.

Through inspection/consultation:

- Auditing safety and health programs
- Assisting in preparing ventilation programs
- Teaching mine rescue training
- Auditing processes for safety and health problems

The Mine Act of 1977 requires miners working in surface, underground coal, metal and nonmetal mines to complete the following training under Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 30, Part 46, 48, 49, 56/57 and 77.

- Annual Refresher
- New Miner
- First Aid (titled under CFR 30, part 56, 57 and 77)
- CPR
- Mine Rescue
- Other site-specific, custom-tailored training
